STANDARD FOR VARIANCE

Use variances require a showing of "unnecessary hardship" while non-use variances require the applicant to demonstrate a "practical difficulty."

In determining whether a PRACTICAL DIFFICULTY exists, the Board should consider the following standards:

- 1) Whether compliance with the strict letter of the restrictions governing area, setbacks, frontage, height, bulk or density would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome.
- 2) Whether a grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district, or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.
- 3) Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.
- 4) Whether the plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances of the property and not general conditions in the area.
- 5) Whether the problem is self-created.

For a use variance, the Board must find UNNECESSARY HARDSHIP on the basis of substantial evidence that:

- 1) The property cannot reasonably be used in a manner consistent with existing zoning,
- 2) The landowner's plight is due to unique circumstances and not to general conditions in the neighborhood that may reflect the unreasonableness of the zoning,
- 3) A use authorized by the variance will not alter the essential character of a locality, and
- 4) The hardship is not the result of the applicant's own actions.

Definitions:

Variance.

A *Variance* is a modification of the literal provisions of the Zoning Ordinance that may be granted by the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) because strict enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance would cause undue hardship owing to the circumstances unique to the individual property on which the variance is granted. The crucial points of a variance are proving that there is undue hardship and/or a unique circumstance that applies to the property. An example of a variance could be to allow the total height of a single family residential home to be above 30' because the property is within the floodplain and the first floor of the home must be higher than grade.

Hardship:

A *Hardship* is the inability to make reasonable use of the property in accord with the literal requirements of the Zoning Ordinance. To justify a variance, a hardship must be demonstrated and this hardship must be due to unique circumstances involving the property. The unique circumstances must be related to a physical characteristic of the property itself, not to the owner's personal situation. This is because regardless of ownership, the variance will run with the land. An example of a hardship could be a lot that is narrower than the majority of other lots on the block or a lot that is shallower than the other lots.

In granting a variance the Board may attach conditions regarding the location, character, and other features of the proposed uses as it may deem reasonable.
